ROWING CANADA AVIRON REQUEST FOR EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST: 2018 National Team Coach Positions

Rowing Canada Aviron is seeking expressions of interest from qualified coaches for the following programs for the 2018 season:

RCA Senior Program – Assistant Coach

Program Dates: Approximately March – October, 2018 (Negotiated on an individual basis)

Location: London, Ontario &/or Victoria, BC

Coaches will work closely with RCA Head Coaches (Men's, Women's & Para-Rowing Programs) to prepare crews for 2018 World Cups and World Rowing Championships regattas &/or alternative competitive event (location and event to be determined). Please note as an integrated program, all *Senior Program* references within this document include our Para-Rowing program.

Under 23 Team – Crew Coach

Program Dates: Approximately June – July, 2018 (Negotiated on an individual basis)

Location: London, Ontario &/or Victoria, BC

Coaches will travel with the U23 National Team to either the World Rowing Under 23 Championships in Poznan, Poland from July 25th to 29th, 2018 &/or to another event (eg U21, or FISU)

Junior Team:

World Rowing Junior Championships – Crew Coach

Program Dates: Approximately July - August, 2018 (Negotiated on an individual basis)

Location: Victoria, BC

Coaches will travel with the U19 National Team to the World Rowing Junior Championships in Racice, Czech Republic from to August 8th to 12th, 2018

CanAmMex Regatta – Crew Coach

Program Dates: Approximately July 8th to 15th, 2018 (Negotiated on an individual basis)

Location: Location to be confirmed in Mexico

CanAmMex Regatta includes a pre-event training camp in Mexico, directly prior to the CanAmMex Regatta.

Qualification Requirements: RCA appointed Senior Coaches should ideally have NCCP Level 4 certification or are at a minimum, an RCA Performance Coach certified (NCCP Level 3 - theory, technical, practical). RCA appointed U23 or Junior Coaches must be RCA Performance Coach, trained.

Responsibilities:

- Prepare athletes/crews in a daily training environment for competition at designated events.
- Fulfil coaching duties as directed by the respective RCA Head Coach, and RCA High Performance Director.

Additional Requirements:

- Report directly to the designated RCA (U19/U23/Senior) Program Lead
- Submit a current criminal record check to RCA prior to assuming coaching duties
- Provide a post event written report that outlines the experience, benefits and issues arising from program involvement
- Work with the respective Lead Coach to develop and maintain a written training program for the crew – to be lodged as part of the post event report
- Proven leadership skills.
- Recognizes and values the expertise of others to help form plans or make decisions.
- Strong effective communicator with the ability to build relationships across a broad range of individuals.
- Experienced working in a high performance environment

Compensation:

All Senior coaching positions will be contract positions. Honorariums may be provided for all other positions to cover travel and or relocation costs and will be negotiated on an individual basis. Successful candidates will have all agreed costs covered while travelling with the team to the respective event, including pre camp costs. Applicants should include a coaching resume and a summary of coaching attributes that you feel contribute to the success of the team. Applicants should indicate the preference for program(s) you wish to work with, preferred coaching location and honorarium expectations.
