Background to the Recommendations

The RCA Committee on Dues and Fees was convened according to Section 8.1 and 8.2 of the RCA Bylaws. A Chair was duly elected at the first meeting on 30th October 2020. The procedures, timetable and information that would be needed by the committee, was determined.

The Committee met again on the 10th November 2020 to review and discuss a comprehensive portfolio of financial information, participant activity data and other relevant information. Following a third meeting on 20th November, in accordance with Section 8.4 of the RCA Bylaws, the Committee formulated its recommendations to the RCA Board as outlined below.

The Committee is satisfied that it received full disclosure of relevant and appropriate financial information and other information that it requested, to support its decision making.

In making its recommendation to the RCA Board, the Committee on Dues and Fees considered the following:

- Based upon last year's Fees and Dues recommendation the 2020/2021 Membership Fees are \$24 per participant, Regatta Seat Fees \$3.50 per event, and Club Dues \$400.
- Historical membership and seat fees. The 'pay as you play' model was put into place on April 1st 2018, thus we had two years of data as well as the baseline before the change available. Due to COVID-19 restrictions, the data for the current year was not comparable. For every competitor category, the combination of the participant fee and the average of the seat fees is less than the former RCA competitive fee rate of

\$50. A significant amount of seat fees (24%) was collected from non-Canadian participants which was higher than expected. In some categories people participated in fewer regattas, which was offset by many more people registering for just one or two.

- Historical financial operating statements were reviewed (back to 2017), including a
 forecast for the current year 2020/2021. A detailed source of funds was also
 provided, outlining historical, budgeted, and forecasted funding. Membership fees
 represented approximately 7% of total revenues, and 32% of national operations
 expenditures, the difference coming from donations, fundraising and events
 (calculations based on approved budget).
- Thanks to RCA's to 'survive and thrive' attitude, significant COVID-19 Response funds were secured, which helped avert a financially disastrous year.
- While the Bylaws require Fees and Dues to be reviewed and proposed annually, last year's committee recommended that cost of living allowance ("COLA") increases be added each year as a matter of course (barring unforeseen circumstances) in order to avoid larger increases in the future. As of October 2020, the annual inflation rate is at a nominal level of 0.7%.
- Due to COVID-19 there has been significant disruption amongst our member clubs and athletes. Furthermore, there is considerable uncertainty as to when the current crisis will come to an end and activities can 'return to normal'.
- Club Membership Dues are \$400, which has remained the same for several years and was not subject to a cost of living increase this year. Last year's committee considered the club fee structure and recommended it be reviewed. The current committee will review the structure and related fees.

Recommendations

The Dues and Fees Committee recommends no changes in Club Membership Dues at this time. A review of the structure will be undertaken by the current committee.

The Dues and Fees Committee recommends no changes to the Base Participant Membership Fees (\$24) or Seat Fees (\$3.50) at this time due to the impact of COVID-19 and the uncertainties lying ahead.

If there is inflationary pressure over the next while, it may be necessary to apply a cost of living increase in the future.

Motion:

That the 2020 RCA Committee on Dues and Fees recommends **no changes** to Club Dues (\$400), Special Association Dues (\$500) or Provincial Association Dues (\$700); and **no changes** to the Base Participant Fee (\$24) or Seat Fee (\$3.50) for the next fiscal year: April 1, 2021 to March 31, 2022

Rationale

- Cost of living inflation for the twelve months ending October 2020 is nominal at 0.7%.
- Due to COVID-19 the financial uncertainty for many Members and Clubs does not justify increases or significant changes for the fiscal period ending March 31, 2022.

RCA MEMBER AND PARTICIPANT ACTIVITY: 2018/2019 - 2019/2020 REGISTRATION AND FINANCIAL COMPARISON

Background

RCA Membership Model

On April 1, 2018, the RCA Membership Model shifted from a model with 2 distinct categories- Sport and Competitive- to the current "pay as you play" model that includes one base membership category and a regatta seat fee. Information about the model including the <u>original proposal</u> and the <u>report that was presented at the 2017 Semi-Annual meeting</u> can be found online in the <u>Members section</u> of the RCA website.

For 2018-2019 and 2019-2020, the Dues and Fees were set as follows:

- Base membership category fee: \$20 per participant
- Regatta seat fee: \$3.25 per event
- Club Dues: \$400
- Provincial Rowing Association Dues: \$700
- Special Rowing Associations and Associate Organizations Dues: \$500

The 2018-2019 fees were established during the development of the RCA Membership Model proposal based on a combination of evidence and assumptions related to the following participant activity:

- The total # of registered participants is 12,700 and 4,500 are competitive
- The average # of events attended by participant/year is five (5)
- The average # of seats/participant at an event is two (2)

Additionally, fees were set to recover the typical RCA participant revenue from recent years and the cost required for the system to support the new membership model. The original intent was to collect a total of \$430,833.33 from participant and seat fees during the 2018-2019 fiscal year.

For 2020-2021 the Dues and Fees were set as follows:

- Base membership category fee: \$24 per participant
- Regatta seat fee: \$3.50 per event
- Club Dues: \$400
- Provincial Rowing Association Dues: \$700
- Special Rowing Associations and Associate Organizations Dues: \$500

2019-2020 Assessment

- 1. The number of participants attending regattas is higher than expected and on average, participants are not attending as many regattas as expected.
 - From April 1, 2019 -March 31, 2020 a total of **5,877** Canadian participants with RCA numbers competed in RCA sanctioned regattas. This is **31%** ((5877-4500)/4500)) more than the membership model predicted amount and a **7.8% decrease** ((5,877-6,374)/6,374) when compared to the number of participants that competed during the same time frame in 2018-2019.

- From April 1, 2019-March 31, 2019 the average # of regattas attended by participants with RCA numbers/year is **3.6** and the average # of seats/participants with RCA numbers at an event is **1.7.** This differs from the model assumptions that the average # of events attended by participant/year is five (5) and the average # of seats/participant at an event is two (2).
- 2. When compared to the membership model predicted amount, there is a shortfall of \$25,138.33 (\$430,833.33-\$405,695) for 2019-2020. A portion of this shortfall is due to decreased activity in the month of March 2020 as a result of COVID-19.
 - A total of **52,568** seats for the 88 regattas held from April 1, 2019-March 31, 2020 resulted in a collection of **\$170,846** in seat fees. Seat fees were collected from Canadian and other international participants. This is **\$4,283** (2.45%) less than the amount of **\$175,129.50** collected in 2018-2019 and **\$5987.33** (3.4%) less than the model predicted amount of **\$176,833.33**.
 - A total of \$234,849 was collected through participant registrations (including deferred revenue). This is \$17,606 (7.0%) less than the amount of \$252,455 collected in 2018-2019 and \$19,151 (%7.5) less than the model predicted amount \$254,000.
 - i. There was \$8,927 less collected throughout the month of March 2020 compared to March 2019, due to decreased activity as a result of COVID-19.



2019-2020 RCA FUNDING AND REVENUE






Total RCA Income 2019/20 \$7,108,711
